Ordinance 91-3

To authorize the County to make necessary repairs, replacements and improvements to, and to purchase and install equipment for use in, buildings and facilities of the County, and to borrow money to pay therefor.

Section 1. The Board of County Commissioners is hereby authorized to make necessary repairs, replacements and improvements to, and to purchase and install equipment for use in, buildings and facilities of the County, and to employ professional services for the design of such repairs, replacements, improvements and for the specification of such purchases and installation of equipment, as follows:

- (a) renovation and improvement of the electrical wiring within the Superior Courthouse;
- (b) construct a new handicapped access on the east entrance; make handicapped improvements to the west entrance; renovate the existing toilet facilities in the basement to make them handicapped accessible; construct a new handicapped accessible toilet facility on the first floor; and make improvements to the existing walkways at the Registry of Deeds/Probate Building;
- (c) refurbish surfaces and replace carpeting in the courtroom, balcony and outside entrance to the courtroom at the Superior Courthouse.
- Section 2. For the purposes set forth in section one, the County Treasurer, with the approval of the County Commissioners, may borrow from time to time, on the credit of the County, such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding, in the aggregate, one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars, and may issue bonds or notes of the County therefor, which shall bear on their face the words, Barnstable County Facilities and Equipment Loan, County Ordinance of 1991. Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan, and such loans shall be payable in not more than five years from their dates.
- Section 3. All bonds or notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be signed by the County Treasurer and countersigned by a majority of the County Commissioners. The County may sell securities at public or private sale upon such terms and conditions as the County Commissioners may deem proper but not for less than their par value. Indebtedness incurred under this ordinance shall, except as herein provided, be subject to Chapter thirty-five of the Massachusetts General Laws.
