What is strategic planning?

 An organization recreating itself from within to achieve a common purpose. The objective is to make decisions about the future.

Who are we?

- Do we still need to raise awareness of our presence on Cape Cod?
- Explicitly state we are not clinical and do not provide direct services.
- Provide resources, trainings and platform for conversation for all impacted by hoarding including healthcare providers.
- Hoarding disorder sounds like we are diagnosing. Add clutter to mission.

Not all items listed may in fact be discussed and other items not listed may also be brought up for discussion to the extent permitted by law.

What do we do?

- Provide resources to anyone impacted by hoarding. This can include: municipal governments; families; individuals; health and safety officers; professionals; housing managers; and DCFS.
- How do we know if we are reaching all persons of all ages included in the target: log contacts; membership forms; and google analytics to track website views.
- How do we reach the younger audiences?
- Ways for each committee member to dedicate 1-2 hours per month to the task force.
- Task Force needs to utilize existing opportunities for PR (brochures, fact sheets, etc.) and plan future PR opportunities.

Vision

- Be so successful that in 5 years the group is unnecessary
- Gather more involvement and membership from housing court, police, fire and EMS,
 and legislation
- Create an app (similar to clutter-image rating app) for professionals and families to use during clean-outs.
- Presentations to cape-wide managers and high-profile decision makers to establish a higher profile and as a group of experts
- Catalyst for direct services Housing Assistance, Duffy, etc.
- Link to a foundation
- Become a clearinghouse for data
- Charge for trainings and use fees as a source of revenue

Strategies

- Continue providing trainings and Buried in Treasures workshops
- Present to key organizations: town managers, police and fire chiefs
- More engagement and collaboration with others doing this work
- Expand the level of conversation around the topic of hoarding, raising awareness and reducing stigma
- Provide learning and collaboration opportunities for all levels

Action Plan (2018)

- Press releases every month from now until July Kaliope will have this responsibility
- Track sources of contact from website (using google analytics) and from emails to use as
 hard data Ali will be responsible for this until September 2018
- Charge for trainings
- Host a community forum in October 2018
- Become catalyst for direct services Erika: HAC; Kevin: mental health; Kaliope: veterans;
 Lori: Dennis, Town Manager
- Review current research on hoarding and write a white paper to present in the future

- Identify decision makers and determine how the committee can support them.
