

Managing your health care at home can be a complicated process, especially when it comes to disposing home health care supplies like syringes and lancets.

Sharps are devices used to manage medical conditions that can puncture or cut skin. These items are called Household Sharps.



Who Uses Sharps On Cape Cod?

How to Store Sharps Between Drop Offs

- Deposit used syringes and lancets into an approved sharps container.
- Label your container, "Contains Sharps" and immediately put used sharps into the container.
- Close your container between uses.
- Bring a portable sharps container when travelling.
- Store your container in a safe place away from children and pets.

DO NOT...

...flush sharps down the toilet!

...drop sharps into storm drains!

...clip, bend, or recap sharps!

SHARPS CANNOT GO IN YOUR TRASH!

Improper disposal of sharps can pose a
health and injury risk to adults, children,
pets, wildlife, waste management staff,
and healthcare workers.
