A Proclamation: March 2021 Women's History Month

Be it Hereby Resolved by the Barnstable County Assembly of Delegates:

Whereas we honor indigenous, enslaved, and immigrant women of all races, backgrounds, identities, colors, and creeds for their courageous work to end oppression and birth opportunities for parity, and;

Whereas we recognize the historic, and the every-day, contributions and achievements of women throughout the workplace, across local, state, and federal public service roles, serving in our military branches, within non-profit and faith organizations, as the engines of change in social movements, at the hearth of our homes, and at the heart of our communities across the Cape and Islands, and;

Whereas we acknowledge this enduring legacy of our Nation's women as we celebrate the diversity of their backgrounds, identities, talents, accomplishments, and gifts, which expand our democracy and power our prosperity:

Now, Therefore:

The Cape Cod Regional Government, known as Barnstable County, hereby resolves:

That March 2021 is hereby proclaimed as Women's History Month and all are called upon to observe this month with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities. Additionally, all are invited to learn more about the generations of women who have helped shape our Nation's history, yielding a brighter future for all, at www.WomensHistoryMonth.gov

The foregoing Resolution 21-02 was adopted by the Barnstable County Assembly of Delegates, by a roll call vote of 99.07% voting "YES", and 0.93% "ABSENT" at the regular virtual meeting held on March 17, 2021.
