## CAPE COD REGIONAL GOVERNMENT ASSEMBLY of DELEGATES 2024 Session Resolution No. 2

Calling on the Board of Regional Commissioners to introduce a proposed ordinance establishing a Water and Wastewater Stabilization Fund

**Whereas,** Cape Cod regional government water quality and wastewater programs provide testing, monitoring and research in every stage of water use; from recreation, to drinking, to wastewater disposal; and

**Whereas,** those programs also provide an effective and efficient means of financially assisting area residents with often cost-prohibitive yet essential septic system requirements; and

**Whereas,** all 15 of Barnstable County's towns rely on a single source aquifer–the Cape Cod Aquifer– for 100% of their drinking water needs; and

**Whereas,** effective wastewater management is essential to public health and environmental protection in our region; and

**Whereas,** due to unprecedented excess deeds excise revenue during fiscal years 2021, 2022, and 2023, the Cape Cod regional government's unreserved fund accumulated a balance that exceeded \$27,761,774 as of June 30, 2023, and

**Whereas,** Ordinance 2020-15 authorizes the Cape Cod regional government to create special stabilization funds into which monies may be transferred for a broad category of spending purposes by ordinance; and

**Whereas,** our Home Rule Charter states a proposed ordinance may be introduced by any member of the assembly of delegates, or by the board of regional commissioners; and

**Whereas,** our government's general counsel has opined that the Assembly of Delegates acts as the County's Advisory Board on Expenditures when acting on appropriations under Section 2 – 4 of our Home Rule Charter and Chapter 35, Section 28B of Massachusetts General Laws; and

Now therefore,

Be it Hereby Resolved by the Cape Cod regional government Assembly of Delegates:

## Section 1.

The Assembly of Delegates calls on the Board of Regional Commissioners to introduce a proposed ordinance: 1) establishing a Water and Wastewater Stabilization Fund, for the purpose of setting aside funds that are to be invested to secure reserves for regional water quality and wastewater programs; and 2) appropriating the sum of \$3 million dollars into that fund by transferring that amount from the unreserved fund balance.

The Assembly of Delegates adopted the foregoing Resolution No. 2 at its regular meeting on May 15, 2023 by a roll call vote with delegates representing 97.25% of the population of Barnstable County voting in the affirmative, and delegates representing 2.75% of the population absent.
